Wondering how to use these coloring pages in your faith community? Here are some ideas to get you started! Depending on your context, these ideas could work as self-guided prayer stations or as part of a worship service. Suggestions for specific pages in this packet use these numbers and letters:

- 1. UKirk U Logo with details (A) and without (B); details without UKirk U (C)
- 2. Four rectangles with frame (A) and without (B)
- 3. Full page stained glass
 - In the style of <u>Praying in Color</u> by Sybil MacBeth, write a person, place, or situation in one of the blank spaces, and spend time in prayer for that thing as you color the shapes around it. (Any page could work, but 1 and 2 have bigger spaces for words.)
 - To celebrate your community on a single page, invite folks to write their name in one of the blank spaces on 1A or B. You might take this chance to create a covenant together with actions or attitudes that are important to your community, and make adding their names be a sign of agreeing to it.
 - For an Offering or Prayers of the People, cut 2B into individual rectangles. Invite people
 to write their name in the center of one, then color the border based on how they're
 feeling that day (for a more detailed prompt, use the color chart on page 66 of <u>2024's</u>
 UWorship resource).
 - With any of these ideas, create a community collage using 1 as the centerpiece and inviting community members to add their versions of 2 or 3 around it.
 - Add your community's logo or name to the center of 1C.
 - Keep it simple and enjoy some quiet time coloring these pages however you want. :)
